



### Pregnancy Test / Spayed Declaration

Undertaking pregnancy testing in Australia must be completed by a registered veterinarian unless you are in the Northern Territory or Western Australia, where it may be completed by a competent pregnancy tester.

\*\*If the livestock are spayed, then the declaration is to be completed by the owner / manager.

#### Declaration for Pregnancy Testing *(completed by Veterinarian / competent pregnancy tester only, if applicable)*

I, \_\_\_\_\_ (name) being the vendor / authorised management representative of the above described cattle that have been presented for export were all pregnancy tested on \_\_\_\_\_ (date – must be within 30 days of export) by \_\_\_\_\_ (name of registered veterinarian or competent accredited pregnancy tester\*) and were declared to be not detectably pregnant. A valid certificate must be attached and include the following details.

- Name of Registered Veterinarian / competent pregnancy tester
- Accreditation Number
- RFID number
- Location where the pregnancy testing took place
- Date of pregnancy testing

#### Declaration for Spaying *(\*\*completed by vendor / authorised management only if applicable)*

I, \_\_\_\_\_ (name) being the vendor / authorised management representative of the above described cattle that are presented for export were all spayed, using the Willis dropped ovary technique at least thirty (30) days prior to export) **or** have been spayed not less than 280 days prior to \_\_\_\_\_ (date – must be within 30 days of export).

Declare the cattle described above and presented for export were not treated with prostaglandin or any other drug intended or likely to cause abortion or induce premature calving, within fourteen (14) days of export.
