Declaration:

I, _____ (BLOCK LETTERS) being the authorised owner/manager of the above-described animals comply with the following conditions:

1. No lame, blind, injured, sick or substituted animals will be loaded on road transport to Registered Establishment.
2. To the best of my knowledge, all livestock sourced for export comply with Australian food safety requirements, including standards for chemical residues and environmental contaminants.
3. The animals for export have been resided in Australia since birth.
4. Livestock have been sourced from properties free from any known outbreaks or clinical symptoms of the following diseases prior to shipment:
 - Johne’s disease: No official reports within five (5) years prior to shipment.
 - Bluetongue, Bovine Malignant Catarrhal Fever, Mucosal Disease/Bovine Virus Diarrhoea (MD/BVD), Q Fever, Infectious Bovine Rhinotracheitis/IPV, Haemorrhagic Septicaemia, Ephemeral Fever, Leptospirosis, and Enzootic Bovine Leucosis: Free for three (3) years prior to export.
 - Anaplasmosis, Babesiosis, Sporadic Bovine Encephalomyelitis, Surra, Bovine Genital Campylobacteriosis, Trichomoniasis, and Anthrax: Free for twelve (12) months prior to export.
 - Theileriasis, Cysticercosis, Intestinal Salmonella Infections (Salmonellosis), and Hendra Virus: Free for six (6) months prior to export.
 - Trichomyopsis (Ringworm), Contagious Ophthalmia (Pink Eye), Actinomycosis, and Dermatophilosis.
 - Within thirty (30) days prior to shipping, all cattle have been free from clinical evidence of any disease.
5. The cattle have never been fed any kind of processed animal proteins. No cattle are within a withholding period or Export Slaughter Interval (ESI) for antibiotics. The cattle do not contain hormone growth promotant residues at levels harmful to human health, as determined by Codex Alimentarius food safety standards. Cattle have shown no clinical signs or abattoir evidence of Enzootic Bovine Leucosis (EBL) within the last two (2) years.
6. The cattle have never been fed any kind of mammalian-derived protein, except milk proteins.
7. Female livestock have not been treated with a prostaglandin drug within fourteen (14) days of export, and not during the 60-day period before export unless they have been pregnancy tested immediately before prostaglandin treatment and declared to be not detectably pregnant.
8. Transport: All livestock moved to a Registered Establishment will be transported by operators who comply with the current version of the Australian Standards for the Export of Livestock (ASEL) and relevant Land Transport Standards. The land transport of livestock for export must also meet all applicable animal health, welfare, and road transport requirements under State and Territory legislation, as well as relevant provisions of the National *Model Codes of Practice for the Welfare of Animals*.
9. **Thailand only:** Cattle have been resident on the property for at least six (6) months prior to dispatch to the Registered Establishment.
